### SOCIAL SECRETARYS REPORT



This report will cover our social calendar, as well as some of the other initiatives that were developed to increase our member engagement in 2019. These were all geared towards helping improve the participation and experience of our members during this year and beyond. It is a detailed report and I hope that it gives you some insight into the scale of the work and programs that were created by your volunteers in 2019.

#### **SOCIAL EVENTS**

Social events provide a platform for our umpires to socialise, make friends, take part in their community and find a place to belong. They are a place for friendships to start, and a place for our former umpires and life members to reconnect. They take considerable time to plan, organise, fund and deliver. My aim of the 2019 social calendar was to have a diverse range of events that were delivered in various ways so that all members could find an event that suited their needs and interests. Here is a summary of our events:

We kicked off the year with a hugely successful Barefoot Bowls BBQ at Heathmont Bowls Club with over 100 umpires and their families in attendance. It was great to see such a range of ages in attendance, as well as families and a large contingent of Life Members. Having this event during pre-season was also a great chance for umpires to build on friendships and team spirit around our club. This event was free for members.

We hosted our Season Launch at our

clubrooms and invited guest speaker Sean Bell from Jog for Joey, to address the group. Sean had recently completed 50 marathons in 50 days in memory of his friend, and also a former EFL Umpire, Joseph Moschetti who passed away suddenly in 2016. The group were hooked on Sean's story and were all inspired by both the physical and mental feat that Sean had completed. As an association we donated \$600 to his charity to help him continue to raise awareness for his cause through running. The Association decided to make Sean our number 1 ticket holder for the year. It was wonderful to have Sean attend several training nights and social events through the year to build on the relationship. Lots of umpires also joined Sean during his 24-hour run. We were very proud to support Sean on his journey, and thought the mix of his message and charity through fitness and running was a nice match for our community. After its success in 2018, we continued with our Autumn Sports Carnival Night. More than just a game of tunnel ball, it brought our club together across all disciplines and skill levels in order to develop teamwork and communication skills, as well as give our members a night of fun at training as they get to know each other more in a positive environment. It is one of the highlights of the year to see so many umpires smiling, laughing, making new friends and having a good time. We are very fortunate to have many skilled facilitators in our group, and I extend my thanks on behalf of our members to Hugh Tevelein, Tino Tabachhiera, Dan Beard, Luke McIlroy, Pieter Van Pinxteren and Mark Corrie who ran stations on the night. A huge team effort with many other committee members as well as life members, helping with various jobs on the night. Our Golf Day in June was held at Freeway Golf Course. All places were booked out

with a waiting list further highlighting the significant increase of engagement of our members, compared to previous years where we struggled to fill spots. On a crisp morning there were lots of laughs, interesting shots and more lost balls than pars. Congratulations to Andrew Gillies and David Kennedy who took out the tournament. John Adams was instrumental in helping to organise this event, and I wish to acknowledge and thank him for his contribution. Lou Tabacchiera donated all of the prizes for the day and we thank him for his sponsorship of the event.

During two Wednesday nights of the year, the EFLUA hosted a themed dinner night. The rooms were decorated, meals served were in-line with the theme and members were encouraged to dress up. We also ran an iPod Shuffle competition on the night with various prizes being offered depending on when your song was played. Congratulations goes to Will Caldwell on taking out the major prize. Thank you to those coaches who assisted with appointing umpires with their requests on the day and those on the committee who helped run the bar, set up and pack up on the night. Before we knew it, we were into the most exciting time of the year — finals! Our Junior Umpires were celebrated at the Junior Appointments Night. The EFLUA supported this event through the organisation of a venue in Ringwood Secondary College, which I'm sure

everyone can agree was a huge step up from the previous year. The EFLUA also contributed some funds towards the event for our junior members. Congratulations to Sean Clarke and his team on a fantastic celebratory event!

The attention then turned to our Senior umpires with the announcement of our Grand Final Umpiring Panels, EFLUA and EFL awards and more at The Last Bounce. Over 200 members, life members, partners, family and friends packed out Linley Estate for the biggest night on the EFLUA Social Calendar for the last 9 years. Those in attendance enjoyed a delicious 3-course dinner, drinks and entertainment. As always, it was a fantastic night to celebrate those committed and hardworking umpires both on and off the field. Our members received significant subsidy off this event, which showed our continued commitment to our members in 2019. All of these events were made possible with the help of the committee and other people who just put up their hand to help. If you helped contribute to an event throughout the year by helping to cook a BBQ, working behind the bar, selling raffle tickets, collecting payments and so much more, I thank you for your support. #### **MEMBER PACKS**

At the end of 2018, in an effort to try and re-energise our membership base, I designed a membership pack with the support of the committee. It was hoped that the pack would be a significant incentive for umpires to sign up to be a member in 2019. Our membership pack not only provided great value for money for our members, but it also helped develop our brand, and most importantly the spirit and engagement at our club. Whilst we often talk about giving value back to our members, it is also important for committees to understand the value in which is returned to them through the investment. Each item in our membership pack was thought through to ensure that it too gave a return to our club.

Having every member in the same training top was a huge step in developing team culture around our club. When we all train in a unified outfit, there is a greater sense of being part of a team. Caps provided a sun smart option for our members, as well as an item that they could wear into the local community to spread our brand. Members received a membership card that included 2 free drinks and a meal, as well as exclusive member deals. This was designed to try and get members to stay back after training and enjoy a meal or a drink together and bring some atmosphere to our club rooms.

Whilst the investment in this membership packs was huge for the EFLUA, there is no doubt that we saw significant reward in the ways in which people engaged in our club this year. We had record high member numbers. I was able to pack and hand out over 230 membership packs. This was no easy organisational task, and I thank the members for their patience with this. Thank you to Scott Van Noordennen and Mark Freeman for their assistance in the ordering of apparel items.

Through our not-for-profit status I was able to secure and set up a free q-suite for the EFLUA. This has allowed us to create more professional email accounts with our own URL, as well as develop digital drives to store and backup the Associations data. All of this is a huge advance in collaborative tools for the committee, making sure our history and records are kept safe. It also makes the handing over of committee positions easier and more transparent. Further work needs to be done in the coming years to scan, archive and store important items and documents, and in the creation of mailing lists that will make contacting groups of people much simpler. Whilst it took me significant time to set up this year, it is hoped that with services like this lots of work of the future EFLUA committee can be streamlined.

Our brand-new website eflumpires.org.au took me a significant amount of my time to get designed and running. However, the importance and rewards of having this have been seen. With the addition of this website we were able to secure some great sponsors that allowed us to fund the programs and events we were running. The website gave these businesses exposure and with the addition of appointments to the website our web traffic grew significantly. Tino Tabacchiera was instrumental in making this happen. The website allowed us to release our social calendar and it became a point of access to a plethora of information for prospective and current umpires, as well as life members. It also increased our brand in the community significantly. We had many strangers contact us through the website to pass on positive feedback about an umpire they saw, ask questions about umpiring, wanting to join up to umpire and more. This type of engagement, whilst it was unexpected, further highlighted the need for a strong online present to showcase our community.

Sitting strongly next to our website were our social media platforms (Facebook, Instagram, Twitter). Through social media we were able to connect with many of our members

across a range of ages, but particularly with our younger members. Creating quality content that aligned with our developed brand standards for the year gave our online presence more professionalism and grew our followers significantly. It allowed us to share our club to the wider community on a regular basis. It also was key in helping to drive traffic to our website.

#### FINALLY...

In October I made the decision that I would not be continuing on the EFLUA committee in any capacity in 2020. I'm sorry if that disappoints you. There is no doubt a whole lot more I wanted to contribute and I am sad that I won't get to see the full pay off of the new initiatives, engagements and infrastructure I designed for the club. I have enjoyed a lot of my time helping on various committees over the last 9 years, and I wish the team in 2020 well.

It was a massive season! I hope this report gave you an understanding into the huge amount of thought, time, energy, skill and dedication that goes into a successful year. It's not always easy, but seeing umpires find their place within our club with a big smile on their face makes it all worthwhile! I hope that in 2020 and beyond, our club and the EFL community, can celebrate our volunteers and the huge amount of work that they do. As in umpiring, we might not get it right 100% of the time, but we get pretty close!

### TREASURERS REPORT



Financially the EFLUA continues to remain in a strong position closing the year with a bank balance of \$22017.62. One of the key financial drivers of the EFLUA is to ensure we deliver value to our members. This year's membership package included a training top, cap, meal and drink vouchers. Added to these were subsidies for members for various activities

throughout the year. A generous subsidy for members attending the Last Bounce, ensuring that this year's membership offered real value for money.

This year was perhaps one of the most difficult encountered by the position of treasurer. The misappropriation of funds over several years was uncovered. Considerable distress was felt by many members of the EFLUA community. This has now been well documented and dealt with.

The learning to come form this is twofold.

Firstly, our systems for handling both cash, and income in general, have been overhauled.

Updated processes and procedures are now in place to significantly reduce this type of risk exposure in the future. Secondly, it also highlights the responsibility of those on the committee. While a voluntary position,

members must actively take an interest in all reports, particularly financial, tabled at committee meetings. Questions should be asked where clarification is needed to ensure that the interest of our members is being protected.

I extend my sincere gratitude to all those that have helped navigate this role with me in 2019. I look forward to 2020 with renewed enthusiasm knowing that the committee is armed with the right expertise, knowledge and passion to deliver another year of great outcomes for its members.

### HEAD OF UMPIRING REPORT



At the start of this season we set about creating even more opportunities for umpires to grow from our junior competition to our senior competition. We introduced two new development areas in the Emerging Umpires Group & The Female Field Umpires Group and appointed new coaching positions in these groups. The response from the groups was amazing. In the emerging Umpires Group, we saw 63 umpires who umpired juniors last season progress into our Saturday competition with our U19s competition being the beneficiary of this group. This season we have seen over 160 junior umpires progress from our junior competition into our senior competition. The pathway at the EFL Umpires is a very clear and open to anyone who wants to progress their umpiring.

The coaching group completed over 900 written observations for our entire umpiring list. This is a fantastic result and supports our message to the group that we are determined to ensure that all umpires receive not only group-based coaching, but individual coaching in the form of a written game day observation.

The benefit of so many observations is that the club has seen the progression of junior umpires transitioning into Saturday Senior football. The strong growth in our senior list is improving into a higher standard of football. Match day observations will continue to be a strong aspect in our seasons moving forward as it allows us to continually reinforce the 4-pillar philosophy and create opportunities for growth and feedback.

Overall the performance by our umpires in the 2019 finals campaign was strong. This finals campaign saw a great mix of experience.

Some umpires doing their first senior final and they all performed very well. As we move to be more reliable and trusting amongst each other as umpires this will see the team aspect grow and give us a higher and more consistent level of umpiring in the EFL.

I would like to thank **Bruce Onken** (Senior Field Coach), **Neville Nash** (Female Umpire Development Coach), **Nathan McDonald** (Emerging Umpires Coach) **Stephen Smith** (Boundary Coach), **Trevor Finch** (Boundary Assistant Coach), **Pieter Van Pinxteren** (Boundary Assistant Coach), **Warren Sidebottom** (Goal Coach), **Sam Walsh** (Goal Assistant Coach) for their wonderful contribution and leadership shown throughout the season with their respective groups and the work you all did in creating and supporting opportunities for umpires to develop.

We have multiple opportunities on offer which is a pleasing result.

### BOUNDARY UMPIRES COACH REPORT



At the time of writing this piece, it would appear as though it was only twelve months ago that the last summer long weekend would have been celebrated, and the much anticipated email/Team App reminder would appear in the inbox, reminding ALL, that the commencement of pre season was about to commence at Ringwood Secondary College.

For several weeks, at a location that couldn't be more satisfying, closely regarded as my backyard (Ringwood resident), the league was growing rapidly with the inaugural summer development program, where all first year umpires we're exposed to the several disciplines within the EFL ranks. It looked to be a successful program, with numbers in Junior Field, Boundary and Goals having growth.

With the season about to commence, **Trevor Finch** and myself had discussed the format in which the year was to take. We identified that we had a very strong core group of experience now within the Boundary Umpiring group, and it was now the ideal time to make these young leaders more accountable.



For the first half of the season, as we do every year since my involvement, Trevor and my attention is largely spent seeking out new talent, and coaching most first year umpires on game day. It was such a thrill to see what new blood had arrived over the summer. I knew I had an opportunity to grasp a new core of talent that could be coachable, exceed theirs and my own expectation. This would give a number of new umpires a real taste of what local football at the top end looks like. It will take the experience and commitment to stay at the top of our discipline.

We established that 16 of our boundary umpires would become leaders through out the season, and with 40 new umpires amongst the group, it was now up to these individuals to help build relationships, engage the new umpires to attend events, display umpiring excellence at games, and give feedback to new umpires on game day. This program ran for 4 weeks during the middle of the season, and its success, was a true reflection as to what was to come leading up to finals.

Our senior panel had been floorless throughout the season, giving 100% in all areas, particularly at training where the camaraderie and banter is at its best, their attendance at all functions and behaviour is best displayed, and general respect and care for one another. So when the time came towards the pointy end of the season, I knew in my heart, with whatever decisions needed to be made on an individual's performance, their peers would be their backbone to support and encourage through the success of others appointments.



We had a tremendous finals campaign, with several of our first year umpires given the opportunity to umpire not just in senior finals, but also in Grand Finals. The contest at the top was blanketed by key personnel, and I wish them all the future success: Daniel Phillips, Flynn Addicott, Brodie Eccles, Daniel Maakasa, David Mitchell, Marcus Allen, Daniel Mortlock, Aaron Van Zuylan, David Woolley, Nicholas Beaton, Lachlan Macrae, Chris Powney, Ryan Pulley, Aiden Miller, Charlie Lawson and Pieter Van Pinxteren for the best four seasons a coach could ask out of you all. ### GOAL UMPIRES COACH REPORT



This year we saw again an influx of new umpires to the goal umpiring discipline.

Unlike last season having a group of new junior umpires sign up, this season we have had umpires return, new umpires from other associations join us and umpires change from other disciplines. This really helped boost the numbers and the depth of the group.

Goals for 2019:

- Recruit 3 female goal umpires
- Employee observers/ assistant coaches
- Further develop and grow the junior numbers

The development of new umpires was made quicker and earlier with the help of clubs requesting goal umpires in practice matches. This is something well worth doing as it allowed me to get around and observe much earlier in the season compared to the previous one.

The decline in the number of Premier Division U19s also made things difficult in trying to accommodate those that have other commitments in the afternoon and still be able to umpire a match. At times some missed out due to lack of matches in the morning. We managed to cover several Premier Reserves matches when the numbers were available.

The goal to recruit three Female umpires was not reached with only successfully managing to find two who umpired most of the year.

The recruitment of **Sam Walsh** & **Jame Rizio** as assistant coaches/observers certainly helped with the number of observations being conducted and development at coaching sessions. A negative from a massive positive is the availability of these two when it came to finals time. With their own umpiring commitments it made things more difficult for them to be available and get along to matches and observe. The knowledge and youthfulness they bring is something I hope they continue to provide to help breakdown the barrier of the 'typical goal umpire' image.

As this position has been advertised I unfortunately have made the decision to step down from the role as Goal Umpires Coach. The two years I have been involved have unfortunately been very difficult with family health issues which I know has impacted my personal performance. With the health of my wife and family as my number one priority I cannot commit to my availability and mental strength to perform at a desired level.

I thank the EFLUA for welcoming me back to the association where my Father once was involved. I hope to be involved in the future whether that is in a development role or even as a running umpire when I am available.



## EFLUA HALL OF FAME & LEGEND



#### Andrew Wheeler (Hall of Fame)

Andrew Wheeler has been a very decorated umpire, not only in the EFL but also the AFL where Andrew has been a boundary not only in AFL grand finals but also AFL overseas exhibition games.

Andrew started his career with the EFL in 1986 as a boundary umpire where he officiated from 1987 and 1988 before progressing in his career to the AFL.

When Andrew completed his time at the AFL he returned to the EFL as Boundary Umpire coach and held this role for three years passing on his knowledge and mentoring younger boundary umpires.

At the conclusion of this time Andrew then moved into field umpiring to bring his overall EFL career tally to 340 plus games.

During his time with the EFL, he has supported the EFLUA by holding positions on the general committee, social committee and Vice President over 10 years before moving into the role of President of the EFLUA where he held the position for four years.

Not only has Andrew been honored to be awarded Life Membership of the EFLUA but

has also been a recipient of the Noel Maxwell award and also an EFL services award.

Andrew has been a very strong contributor to the EFL football and EFLUA during his time in umpiring. These examples indicate that he is a worthy Hall of Fame inductee this year.

#### **Bruce Onken (Legend)**

Bruce played 15 seasons within the Eastern Football League, including 2 seasons as Captain/Coach. He played in 2 Reserve grade Premierships and was a club Best and Fairest winner.

With the increasing physical demands of playing taking their toll he turned to umpiring to maintain his direct interest in our great game.

His personal drive and dedication to be the best he could be saw him progressively move up the ranks which ultimately culminated in a Senior Grand Final.

Although new to umpiring, his professional and leadership skills saw him take upon the role of President of this Association. During the early 90's the relationship between the EFL and the Umpiring group was not what it is today. As a result, his Presidency initially focused

upon the building of trust and a stronger bond within the umpiring group and within the EFL administration.

He spent time on the Croydon Sports advisory Committee, putting forward options to develop the umpires' facilities within the Croydon precinct.

He worked on the Metropolitan Umpire body reviewing pay rates, conditions, retention and recruiting of umpires.

He has assisted umpires at tribunal hearings and through Junior Finals.

With his intense and positive influence over our group he was awarded life membership for Meritorious service and has received the Noel Maxwell Field Umpiring and the EFL Meritorious service award.

He has umpired in excess of 450 games over 26 seasons but is best known for his contribution as an on field mentor to young umpires, Senior Field umpires' observer and Coach – a position he has held for 12 seasons.

His advice and methods are all aimed at progressing the individual and group towards their full potential.

Such is his influence, directly or indirectly, few in this room could say that they have not been influenced by this man's contribution.

His strength of character has seen him fight through challenging personal health issues successfully. We hope he is able to maintain a strong connection with the umpiring group for many seasons to come.

With such an esteemed level of commitment and achievement within the EFL umpires, we elevate Bruce Onken to a Legend of the Eastern Football League Umpires Association.
