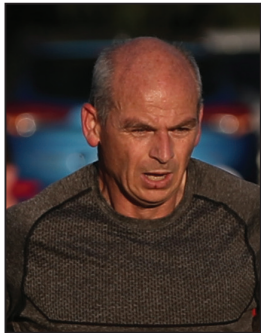
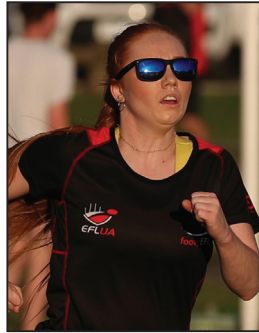

So in closing thank you again, I look forward to an uninterrupted 2022 and I will see you all on the track.

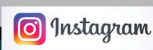

SOCIAL SECRETARYS REPORT

2021 was a strange season where we were unable to complete a full season, however unlike 2020, the benefit we were able to get at least half a season in before it was finally drawn to a close. Due to the nature of the COVID-19 pandemic, the ability to plan social events this year was quite difficult. However, we did manage to host some events which was pleasing given the circumstances.

I'd like to firstly acknowledge and thank

Nathan Macdonald, my predecessor, for the work he put in during 2020. Despite not getting a proper opportunity to show what you're capable of in the context of social events for the association, I thank you for the effort you put in with which we were unable to see the full fruition of.

With season 2021 being my first year in the role, I did not take this position lightly. I put in my best effort under difficult circumstances to provide opportunities for hosting events and ways of connection via social events where possible. I am incredibly passionate about people and connection and understand the importance of bringing events to the club that cater to all ages. Social events are where friendships are born, where people can make new connections, life members can reconnect, and all can share in everlasting memory making. Social events are incredibly important for the EFLUA as they provide opportunities for umpires to develop meaningful relationships with each other off the field which provides long term benefits for the association.

In terms of the events we did manage to host, none of them could have been made possible without the unrelenting help of the members of the 2021 committee and for that, I appreciate everyone for sharing the vision to make these events possible. I am particularly thankful to those on the social sub committee including **David Parker, Damien Sully, Jason Gillow, Bradley Pulley, Jason Hermann, Daniel Philp, Greg Alford** and **Jamie Beattie** for their efforts in facilitating our events in 2021. It takes a village to see a vision through, and these people really stepped up when needed.

Our first official social event for the year

was our annual Barefoot Bowls night which also doubled as our AGM, this was held at Heathmont Bowls Club. We were lucky to strike gold with great weather, a magnificent barbeque run by our committee members and a great turnout with just over 100 umpires past and present, and their families turning up to participate in the bowls. It was great to see some life members present for the AGM and the event was free for EFLUA members.

A great story which came out of 2021 was that the Maroondah City Council in partnership with the Victorian Government announced a project to redevelop our long-time home of the EFLUA, being Springfield Hall. A \$3.5 million project that was certainly long overdue for the well aged and beloved hall. While this was exciting, it meant we were unable to use the facility while the rooms were demolished and rebuilt. In its place, Croydon Football Club graciously provided us with the opportunity to use their club rooms for the entirety of the 2021 season. As a club, we owe Croydon FC much gratitude and appreciation for allowing us to use the rooms while we were without a permanent home.

It was in the rooms at Croydon FC where we held our season launch, which went off with a bang. The atmosphere was filled with excitement, particularly as we were about to recommence community football again after a 18 month layoff.

Our next calendared social event, held in the final week of April, was community round which is dedicated to celebrating the men and women in Green. We were grateful to have six AFL Umpires attend and come down to an EFL Training Session night and share their experiences with umpiring in each of the field, boundary and goal disciplines. We also had Umpiring Growth and Development Coordinator, **Andrew Talbot** deliver a speech in the rooms which was very engaging and well received by all who attended.

In May, it was such a warm and welcoming atmosphere in the Croydon FC rooms every Wednesday night as we celebrated those who were about to make their senior umpiring

debut. It was great to celebrate these moments where possible during the crazy stop-start motion which 2021 brought upon us.

On the 19th of May, we celebrated our first ever pie-night in conjunction with our sponsor, Hueys Bakehouse. There was no way we could pass up the opportunity to have a pie night at the rooms after training and the quality of the pies were second to none. On the same night, we also held a 'Wear Your Sporting Teams Colours to Training' night, where an excellent turnout could be seen on the track where the many colours of our favourite sporting teams flourished under the bright lights of Croydon Athletics Track and Fred Geale Oval. We also launched the sale promotion of the annual MND Freeze beanies which were a great hit throughout the night.

As Victoria entered the first of three lengthy lockdowns, one in February, May and July, this created frustration in our community with EFLUA competitions, training sessions and EFLUA held functions forced to be cancelled.

Once we came out of Victoria's second lockdown in early June, we then moved into our next scheduled social event for the year, which was EFLUA Mates Round. For this round of footy, we got to pair up and run or wave the flags with those we connect with best. This was a special round for the EFLUA as it came at a time where connection with others was lacking due to lockdowns and was longed by all. By dusk, the party was only just getting started! We held our traditional follow up social night where umpires come together to mingle and share in a bite to eat or drink while we reflected on the great memories we made on the day. We are very grateful for the ties that **Paul Dennis**, a Senior Field Umpire within our Association, has with the Mitcham Football Club as they provided us with their club rooms to use while the construction of Springfield Hall continued. Over the space of five hours, it can be estimated that around 50-80 people came and went, as we all enjoyed a great night. Little did we know at the time that this would be our last social event for the year.

TREASURERS REPORT

Our bank balance at the end of 2021 is \$13,283.

Our new rooms offer us 21st Century facilities in a home we can be proud of. The committee over the past few years has been aware that we would need to contribute significantly to the fit out of these wonderful new facilities. Through the accumulation of funds over previous years we have been able to meet our obligations towards these facilities. This includes significant contributions towards furniture, AV equipment and commercial quality appliances for the kitchen. I would also like to acknowledge the work of **Brad Pulley** in arranging the donation of some of our AV equipment, and all the associated work that went with the installation and connection of the AV equipment.

We had good levels of sponsorship in 2021 and I would like to acknowledge the work of **Jason Gillow** in pursuing this on our behalf. I would also like to acknowledge both **Lou** and **Tino Tabacchiera** who continue to sponsor the EFLUA.

The introduction of the “Square” EFTPOS payment system in 2019 has been a fantastic initiative in both minimising financial risk and offering our members an easier way to purchase goods and services. HEAD OF UMPIRING REPORT

After missing an entire season in 2020, we were up and running in 2021 when the season kicked off on April 10 but, unfortunately, there were significant disruptions that impacted the competition as COVID forced the season to end prematurely without finals being played.

It is disappointing that so much football has been lost over the past 2 years and we again face the challenge of regrouping and have another go in Season 2022. There will be a concerted effort to drive umpire registrations for next season earlier than this year while also reaching out to retired players to see if they are interested in transitioning into umpiring.

Community football, as we knew it, looks different at the present time and many elements that we took for granted were not possible this year due to the shortened season and cancellation of the final's series. We missed the functions that generally occurred during September to celebrate our season of umpiring – The Last Bounce, Junior Grand Final Appointments and Awards Night. These were important events that recognised the achievements of umpires during the season and allowed us to celebrate, as a group, our season overall.

Next year will see us in brand new facilities back at Springfield Park which will be very exciting for everyone.

After the cancellation of the 2020 season, it was great to get back onto the field and umpiring footy again in 2021. One of our biggest challenges was how many umpires (across all disciplines) would return to umpire in the EFNL in 2021. Some may have found

alternative pursuits on a Saturday afternoon during the Covid-19 crisis and may have decided not to return to umpiring at all.

Umpire registrations were slow during January, February and March in the Seniors but very healthy in the Juniors with an increased number of 1st year umpires registering. This certainly impacted appointments in the Seniors in the early rounds of the season which saw an average of 92 umpires available to officiate on Saturdays and this resulted in an average of 36 umpires doubling up.

On the back of this, we advertised heavily to recruit umpires in all disciplines to boost our numbers. This saw several umpires return to the EFNL after time away which resulted in significant improvement at the back end of the shortened season with an average of 99 umpires available to officiate on Saturdays which resulted in an average of 30 umpires doubling up.

This season saw 'opportunity' provided to umpires in all disciplines and this will continue to be our focus for next year also. There were numerous debuts in field umpiring in U19's and then reserves and over 20 umpires debuted in senior football, with some officiating in Premier Division for the first time. This focus was also supported in the boundary and goal disciplines.

Several junior umpires made their debut in U19's, officiating with experienced umpires as mentors and their improvement as the season progressed was significant. This experience will give them the foundation to continue umpiring at this level next year and hopefully

progress further into reserves football.

The Junior appointments had problems of their own with ground allocations unknown until mid-week and many, many stand-alone games impacting where umpires were appointed. Umpire availability was a constant concern as was the number of declines after appointments were released each week. Several senior umpires assisted by umpiring on Sundays and hopefully a few more putting their hand up next year to help, will alleviate some of the pressure that mounts each week to cover all the junior appointments.

Once again, **Sean Clarke** found a way to pull it all together and the time and dedication he put into making it all happen, with the assistance of **Graeme Meredith** and **Gerard Bolton**, is outstanding and is greatly appreciated. The expertise in coaching, mentoring, and developing that they provide to the panel of junior umpires through the Flags and Whistles is enormous and results in many talented young men and women graduating to the senior panel as very good umpires.

In closing, I would like to extend a thank-you to **Trevor Finch** and **Des Seaton** for their coaching of the Boundary Umpires and to **Peter Baldry** and **Warren Sidebottom** for their coaching of the Goal Umpires. But, most of all an enormous thank-you to all EFNL umpires whose commitment, dedication and support in such a difficult season is what defines this club and contributes to its success – well done.
