To members of the Eastern Districts Football League Umpires' Association:

Gentlemen,

On behalf of your Executive Committee it is my pleasure to submit for your consideration the Annual Report and Statement of Receipts and Expenditure for season 1975.

During the past football season, our members officiated in three divisions of senior football in the E.D.F.L. competition and also in the Nunawading and District Junior Football League on Sundays.

Season 1975 saw some new faces in 1st Division. Four new men were promoted to the senior panel and congratulations are extended to them on their success. The continued rotation system gave the opportunity to several members to gain selection in the coveted senior panel. Likewise to all other members who officiated in 2nd and 3rd Division Seniors for the first time are also to be congratulated.

Many new faces joined our association last year for the first time and we welcome them and trust that they remain with us for many years. To the members who retired we thank them for their interest in our association and extend to them our

sincere thanks and best wishes.

Match Fees for Umpires only increased \$1 for senior 1st Division games in 1975. The reason given was due to the huge rising costs of running the League and the individual clubs. However the Fee structure for 1976 has been increased 20% across the board

In an attempt to generate more interest in our association 1975 saw the launching of our own newsletter called 'The Men in White'. After careful planning, the newsletter went to press with some sixteen paid advertisers backing it for the whole season. The success of the paper was overwhelming and it is a credit to the association that the

project was an outstanding success.

Another first was the introduction of an information card giving the names of the Executive, telephone numbers, and a complete list of the entire year's social functions with the dates, venue and social secretary looking after each particular event. The entire cost of setting these cards up was again paid by one of the advertisers. From comments received down the line this idea was again well received by our members.
