We also had our lives effected with work where we were all ordered to work from home and keep social distancing to minimise the spread of the virus. For those families that have young children they were all thrown another set of complexities in that they needed to become school teachers overnight. I know that we will look back later in our lives and reflect on this pandemic and realise that we all come through this with flying colours. I also wanted to take this opportunity and appreciation the Troy Swainston and all the administrative team at the EFNL HQ. Most of you would be aware that not only does the league make a significant contribution to the running of our facility, they also support the umpires through the contribution of our coaching and support staff but they have also contributed a significant financial contribution toward furnishing our rooms. Their generous donation made during last year was dedicated toward the tables and chairs. Again I can't express my gratitude towards this and I look forward to the smooth transition from Troy to the new incumbent. Thank you Troy and all the best in your new endeavours.

Whilst our normal running track was out of commission for all of the 2022 season, we were still fortunate to enjoy the usage of the Fred Geale oval and also the oval (or rectangle) alongside the change rooms. Whilst not ideal we were still fortunate enough to have these facilities and enjoy the process of getting fit and having fun. Our trainer Mal put us all through our paces and his energy and experience is always appreciated. The athletic running track underwent some significant in-ground works and I have been advised that the track should be up and running again at the commencement of the 2023 season. We will commence using this track once the allocations are all locked in with the council.

I want to thank our general committee, both current and past. Without your help and dedication I am not too sure how I could have done this.

We also had Umpiring Growth and Development Coordinator, Andrew Talbot come and deliver a speech back at the rooms which was very engaging and well received by all who attended. We were incredibly lucky to have some of the best of the best be with us on this night.

We then progressed onto another fun social event that has been quite popular amongst the group when we have been able to run it in the past couple of years, which is the 'EFLUA Mates Round'. This is a round where umpires get to submit a form and request who is on their umpiring panel (nameingly their mates) for that particular round, and run or wave with them. This really helps to build culture and atmosphere around the place and really uplifts the whole day, as it's not everyday that you get appointed to a game with your mates. Then to top off a ripping day, one of our EFLUA members, Paul Dennis, has strong ties with the Mitcham Football Club, where in conjunction with this club, the EFLUA members go back to the rooms at Mitcham for a big social celebration to really tie together all that embellishes what is, mates round. Umpires, their families and friends are all welcome on this night to have a chat with something to eat or drink and just share in the great memories with those from what happened to everyone in their days games and also just share in those amazing times that we all love and know so well. Over the space of 5 hours, it can be estimated that around 70-80 people came and went within that time. What a glorious night it was

To round out May, we had for the first time took part in 'Wear Orange Wednesday', which supports the SES and was raised and brought to us by one of our committee members, Jake Schachter, that we as a club get behind this day. It was marvellous seeing the turnout of everyone in orange at training then back at the rooms, supporting and donating to a good cause.

As the thick of winter really began to sink and hit us all in June, we partook in the annual sessions that our Fitness Coach Mal Cree, runs at the Goodlife Gym in Wantirna on Monday Evenings. The EFLUA group was lucky enough to partake in an array of classes over a 6 week period which included Cycling, Body Balance, Boxing and Weights classes. This helped to keep our group fit and active even through the thick of winter. On Wednesdays however we still partook in our normal training nights and coaching sessions back at the rooms.

Our annual Queens Birthday social event rolled around the corner, and on Sunday the 12th of June, the EFLUA hosted their annual 'Golf Day'. Noel was not only a Life Member but awarded Hall of Fame status, then later elevated to Club Legend status. A yearly award to the Field Umpires named in his honour, recognises an individual whose contribution to the club reflects that of Noels. His legacy will live on forevermore in this club.

Furthermore in December, we saw another great asset of the league sadly have their life cut short by the sudden passing of Goal Umpire, Henry Sims. Henry was a real Gentlemen. He began umpiring with the EFL back in 1994 and was awarded Life Membership of the EFLUA back in 2008. In 2003, he was dubbed the winner of the Geoff Griffiths Goal Umpire Award. Henry dedicated a large portion of his life to umpiring and always loved socially getting around to mix and mingle with everyone, be it, young or old. He would never drive to his games, rather catch public transport. If you asked Henry how to get to a certain ground by public transport, he could tell you every tram/ train or bus route number you would need to get there.

Both these men will be sadly missed by the wider EFLUA community. We send our condolences to all the families and close friends of both men and will not forget what legacy they left behind in this league.

One last thank you again from me to every single person that helped input in the social calendar this year – to the committee members and general members – you are the hands and feet of this association and nothing would be possible without the help from you all.

With that, I now draw to a close the end of this Social Secretary Report for 2022. In October, I made the decision that I will no longer be continuing on in the role of the Social Secretary for 2022, and that new blood in being Damien De Vincentis will be taking over and fulfilling his purpose in this role.

I have thoroughly enjoyed my time in the last 2 years in this position and am grateful to have been able to leave an imprint on the EFLUA, even if small. It was a lot of work, sometimes not always easy but it was always worth it!

TREASURERS REPORT

First of all, thank you everyone for having such confidence in me taking over the Treasurer role. It has been great to give back to an association that has had such a positive impact on my life.

Our bank balance at the end of 2022 was \$15,426.57.

For \$45, the 2022 memberships included an EFLUA beach towel, cards entitling us to 2 free drinks and meal at our social club as well as member only sponsor deals, member draws and subsidies for social events. Due to the lack of activities at the association last year, we allowed members to use their 2021 membership cards this year.

The EFNL contributed \$6,500 to the association to cover relevant council expenses, while last year their \$5,000 contribution was to cover the cost of some furniture for our brand new facilities. As council expenses exceeded \$6,500, we are currently in discussion with the EFNL to recover these out-of-pocket expenses incurred by the association. We are also in discussion with the league to have them directly pay for all outgoing expenses associated with the running of the training and meeting facilities going forward.

The biggest expense in 2022 were events, which bought our members together again to enjoy the much missed social life down at the EFLUA after two years of them being cancelled. As expected, the largest event expense was The Last Bounce.

\$990 of \$1,649 of sundry expenses were for the hire of Croydon Football Club's facilities in 2021 while our rooms were being refurbished. Technically this is not a 2022 expense but as the invoice was received and paid after the 2021 AGM, we had no choice but to allocate it to 2022. Therefore, sundry expenses are realistically \$659.

\$3,762 for AV equipment for the umpire clubs rooms could potentially have been capitalised. To remain consistent with prior years, we have taken a conservative approach and chosen to continue to expense these items immediately. Although it dilutes profit, it maintains simplicity of the balance sheet.

Our biggest revenues were memberships and events. It was fantastic to have an increase in memberships given the unprecedented events occurring in 2021. Overall, we received membership fee income for 296 memberships totaling \$13,320.

Bar sales were a huge success particularly at Trivia night and the Premier after party. Bar and kitchen sales generated us \$4,580 in profit, resulting in a 36% profit margin.

Trivia night was yet again a fantastic night, generating fundraising revenue of \$1,435.

\$5,714 was raised for Greg Alford – one of our highly valued members who sustained a serious infection preventing him from working for several months. This was a wonderful result from our umpiring family and went a long way to help Greg through such tough times.

We also raised \$172 to contribute to the Patrick Cronin Foundation, by our members purchasing wrist bands after the foundation visited our rooms and gave a presentation on their purpose.

Square has yet again been a convenient platform to purchase our goods given the less cash being used as well as minimising financial risk to the association. Once again, EFTPOS sales exceeded cash covering 75.8% of total sales.

Thank you Kim and kitchen team for your dedication and always providing such wonderful meals for our members while producing revenue for our association.

Mention to Jason Gillow for securing such valuable sponsorship agreements once again.

Shout out to David Parker for always having the time to assist me in understanding the background activities of the association, allowing me to fit comfortably into my role.

That is a wrap from me for 2022 and I look forward to continuing my role as Treasurer in 2023.

HEAD OF UMPIRING REPORT

When we reflect on 2022, it is evident that we have had a year to remember for many reasons.

After 2 years of COVID interruptions, we have finally been able to complete a full season of football.

There have certainly been some challenges for all, and this was evident on the 1st night of pre-season training when numbers were well down on previous years' 1st nights of training – unfortunately, we were required to change training nights from the traditional Monday/ Wednesday to Tuesday/Thursday and this may have impacted numbers slightly.

This impacted the 1st few rounds appointments where the number of umpires available led to a high number of double ups to make sure all games had two (2) field umpires appointed.

The Covid Pandemic again caused issues, with umpires declining games on Fridays or Saturdays at late notice because they tested positive to Covid – an example of this was in Round 12 when three (3) field umpires pulled out games on Saturday morning when they tested positive with the virus

With the support of the entire umpiring panel, we were able to appoint at least two (2) field umpires in every game (Senior, Reserves and U19's) each week and boundary and goal umpires in all bar a handful of games each week.

A positive from the season was the return to the EFNL of several experienced field umpires (12 in total) who had been absent for a couple of seasons.

In-season training was also going to be a challenge for the panel as our normal venue, the Town Park Athletics Track in Croydon was closed for upgrade works, but this was offset by us being able to access the gridiron field adjacent to the Springfield Pavilion which the goal umpires used on Wednesday nights.

The field and boundary umpires trained at Fred Geale Oval on Monday and Wednesday nights and the ground was surprisingly in good condition for most of the season.

Mid-season saw Monday night training conducted at Goodlife Gym for a 6-week

period which were good recovery sessions for the umpires after big weekends of umpiring for some. The sessions included cycling, boxing and lifestyle fitness sessions during, what is traditionally, the dampest month(s) of the season.

After each weekend of Grand Finals (Seniors, Reserves and U19's), everybody was taking about how good the games were and no mention of the umpiring - all umpires involved in these games enhanced the spectacle with very good performances. This is what makes it worthwhile for the umpire coaches who put their faith in the umpires selected to umpire grand finals and they duly delivered as expected.

Congratulations to all umpires who were appointed to Grand Finals in Season 2022. The performances of all umpires justified the umpire coaches' selections and we were all very proud of the way each panel conducted themselves both on and off the field.

One of the biggest highlights of the year was the opening of our new clubrooms at Springfield Park Pavilion in Croydon. The facility included separate male/female change rooms, a large social room and separate meeting area if required, a fully equipped kitchen, plus a separate bar area and several storage rooms. Many attended on Wednesday nights to take full advantage of the social atmosphere provided, enjoy a meal prior to the weekly coaching sessions and have a couple of drinks with mates after.

Thanks to the ladies in the kitchen (including Jamie Beattie) for their tireless efforts each Wednesday nights in cooking meals for the hungry troop after training. The variety of meals served each week was very much appreciated by the umpiring group. The new kitchen facilities would certainly have made it easier to prepare and cook the meals

Our junior program, under the guidance of Sean Clarke with the assistance of Graeme Meredith and Gerard Bolton, continues to produce quality young umpires who eventually step up into Seniors when Clarkey thinks they are ready. We are very fortunate to have Clarkey overseeing our Junior Program. The task of filling over 330 appointments each Sunday is huge and very rarely was there a game that didn't have at least one field umpire in, so this is a mighty effort and cannot be understated

Not only does Clarkey and his team produce quality young umpires – he develops good young people who gain many life skills which will set them up outside of football.

I'd like to thank the EFNL Umpire Coaches who provided great support to me and the running umpires this season. Their guidance, feedback and knowledge of umpiring played a huge part in the way we finished off the season during finals.

Also thanks to the EFLUA executive for their hard work in supporting the EFNL Umpiring Panel and looking after their interests. Discussions between the EFNL and the EFLUA were always positive and constructive with a number of outcomes that will benefit the umpires next season

Finally, thanks to the entire umpiring group (field, boundary, goal) for their commitment, dedication, passion, and willingness to step up during the tough periods, doing double ups where necessary, helping the Juniors on a Sunday when Clarkey was desperate and down on numbers

It's this attitude that makes being a part of this club such a privilege and a worthwhile experience and the support you all have given me, and the other umpire coaches is greatly appreciated. It is what defines this club and contributes to it's achievements and successes.
